Chapter One: Rehearsal Strategies

Concert Band Circle Drill

- Seating Arrangement: Ensure students do not sit next to like instruments; mix it up.
 - This arrangement promotes cross-section listening and better ensemble cohesion.

• Activity Instructions:

1. Select 2 to 3 different instrument players and have them play a musical exercise, such as an F-concert scale or an assigned musical passage, to introduce the activity.

2. Choose one player in that group to be the **lead player.** The other players must place their sound "inside" the lead player's sound.

- 3. Emphasize to the non-lead players that the lead player's sound must dominate.
- 4. Alternate the players and continue the activity to allow each member to lead and follow.

• Application:

• This activity can be used effectively with sections (brass, woodwinds, and percussion).

• Purpose:

- 1. Teach students to **listen and adjust balance** (volume).
- 2. Encourage students to make **musical decisions** in real time.
- 3. Help students identify **voice priority** within the ensemble.

This drill cultivates critical listening skills and fosters a stronger, more unified sound within your concert band.
